# Noteworthy

Anglers should try The Canada, as the locals call it, for a nice change of pace. It, too, is a brook trout only system, just like the watershed it enters. Since it enters the lower Black River, it can be a thermal refuge for brook trout that need to escape the lower Black River in the summer months. The creek does not become good trout water until about the confluence of Montague Creek which is entirely within the privately-owned Canada Creek Ranch. This access site is about the first location an angler can fish it downstream of the ranch. Be aware of private riparian rights if fishing upstream. Brook trout in this reach will tend to be under 10 inches, but larger fish are occasionally caught. Fly fishing is possible here, as it is in the entire Canada Creek. There is a small, fenced electric sub-station at this turn-off with a No Trespassing sign, but don't be deterred. The two-track is public and will take you back to the parking area and a terraced area leading down to the creek.

### Fishing Regulations

This site on Canada Creek is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

#### **Directions to Site**

From M-33 near the county boundaries of Montmorency and Presque Isle, turn west on the access road which extends past the electrical substation facility. Although marked as "No Trespassing," this two-track trail road is public and will take you back to the parking area and a long stairway leading to creek.
