Brook trout are the primary trout species encountered at this location.

Noteworthy

This bridge is often the welcoming view for most anglers to the Black River. It is a scenic location that probably receives the most fishing pressure due to its easy access. Downstream of the bridge is higher gradient with excellent fall spawning areas for fish. The river upstream is popular for some anglers, especially if you venture upstream a very long distance. Large fish are occasionally caught in the general Tin Shanty Bridge area, but smaller fish are more typical.

Fishing Regulations

The Tin Shanty Road Bridge has two regulatory designations for trout fishing. Downstream from the bridge is designated as Gear Restricted. Upstream from the bridge is designated as a Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the southerly bend at Sparr Road 3.0 miles west of Meridian Line Road turn north on Tin Shanty Rd. for 1.9 miles at which point the road will fork and here bear to the right which is the continuation of Tin Shanty Road. From this point the road will continue in a northeasterly direction until the bridge is reached in another 4.0 miles.
