

Platte River Goose Road



Fish Species

Brown Trout; Rainbow Trout; Steelhead

Species Description

Brown trout are the primary species encountered at this location. However, rainbow trout are also available and migratory steelhead can be found here in the early spring and late fall. The river here is shallow and wide, with good gravel present throughout. Natural reproduction for brown trout and rainbow trout occurs and steelhead are stocked at the Platte River State Fish Hatchery each spring.

Noteworthy

The Goose Road Campground access site is a popular yet rustic fishing spot in the middle reaches of the Platte River. This site offers a Forest Resources Division rustic campground with 26 campsites. Many of the campsites are on, or within a short distance, from the river and much of the surrounding area is State land.

Fishing Regulations

The Platte River in the area of Goose Road is designated a Type 4 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the village of Honor continue east on US-31 toward Traverse City. Turn right (south) onto Goose Road immediately after leaving the village of Honor. Follow Goose Road for approximately 2 miles. The campground and lake access will be on the right side of the road. This has signs at the entrance.
