Species Description

The Carp River is stocked with both brown trout and steelhead, but natural reproduction of both species occurs. Brook trout up to 11 inches and browns up to 15 inches have been caught here.

Noteworthy

This location is just downstream of the confluence with the South Branch Carp River, which is colder than the main Carp River. Some of the brook trout caught here are likely from the South Branch. Casting may be difficult due to overhanging trees.

Fishing Regulations

This river falls under two stream types. The Carp River is a Type 4 Trout Stream and the South Branch Carp River is a Type 1 Trout Stream. For more information, refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Regulations found in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

Take M123 north from Moran. Take Burma Road to the west, then turn north on U.S. Forest Service 3458 (aka Nogi A Road). Drive approximately 1.4 miles to the river.
