


State Wildlife/Game Area:

- Huntible Land - General Area
- Parking Lots
- Prepared Ramp
- Wildlife Refuge - DO NOT ENTER!
- Unit Headquarters with kiosk, is a safety zone, off of 118th Ave. near center of refuge
- Ditch/Dike Area Marsh in Area
- Footbridge (near center of map, west side of sec. 17)

Managed Hunting Zones: have special permit requirements - see back of map,

- or see the information kiosk at Unit office, call Unit Office, or call ASGA Office.
- Zones 1, 9, 10 & those parts of 8 in Sections 7, 8, 9 & 17 of T02N R15W, Clyde Twp. Use of dogs allowed.
- Zones 2 to 7 & those parts of 8 in Sections 7, 8, 9 & 17 of T02N R15W, Clyde Twp. Use of dogs allowed - **ONLY while waterfowl hunting!**



Hunter Safety Zones of 150 yards (450 feet) are enforced around all buildings/structures at all times.

SPECIFIC RULES AND PROCEDURES: Note: there's an information kiosk at unit headquarters, which provides more details.

1. During the Allegan local Goose Management Unit (GMU) season, you may not waterfowl hunt any part of the unit without a valid self-registration permit or permit through the managed hunt drawing.
Permits are available at the Allegan SGA Fennville Farm Unit building located at 6013 118th Ave, Fennville, MI 49408.
2. Any alterations to a permit obtained through a drawing, or that is not endorsed by DNR personnel, renders the permit invalid.
3. During the Allegan local GMU season, a general drawing to issue daily hunting permits will be held each day drawings are held.
No permits for the drawing will be issued to any hunting party not present at the ASGA Fennville Farm Unit office by 5:30 am on drawing days. Drawing dates are posted in the annual DNR Waterfowl Digest.
4. All parties registered and present at the general drawing have an equal chance for permits.
5. You must remain at the office until after you have been issued a hunting zone through the drawing, to be eligible to hunt that day.
Your card must be completely filled out for all members of your party before your party number is called to select a zone, or your party will be ineligible.
6. Hunting parties must have a valid daily hunting permit in possession, must hunt in the zone assigned on the permit, and must hunt from corn strips locations where provided, while waterfowl hunting on drawing dates.
7. On days designated as self-registration hunting, each individual hunter must possess a self-registration permit for waterfowl hunting that day. No self-registration permits are needed to hunt non-waterfowl species.
8. Goose hunting ends at 4:00 pm daily. Duck hunting ends at the end of shooting time posted in the annual waterfowl digest.
9. Hunting permits must be returned to the ASGA Fennville Farm Unit office with all harvest information completed, before leaving the managed area. Failure to complete and/or return hunting permits may result in a citation and/or restriction of further hunting opportunities in the managed area.
10. Any hunting stations left open following the drawing, or as hunters return permits, will be re-issued on a first-come, first-served basis until 11:00 am.
11. Youth Days will be posted at the office and in the annual DNR Waterfowl Digest. Youth days will be youth preference drawings. Only parties with licensed youth hunters will be eligible for the youth drawing on these days.
12. Follow all general area rules and procedures, both on this list and in the standard guidelines (see top).
Additional rules are posted at the ASGA Fennville Farm Unit office.
13. It is unlawful to use or possess any shot, whether loose or loaded in shotshells, or a material other than a federally approved non-toxic shot, except single projectile loads. BBB is the largest shot size permitted.

REGARDING DEER HUNTING:

Firearm deer hunting, including muzzleloaders, is not permitted in the Farm Unit. Deer hunting is **ARCHERY ONLY**.

THESE ACTIVITIES ARE PROHIBITED:

1. Entering **FOR ANY PURPOSE**, the area posted "WILDLIFE REFUGE – DO NOT ENTER"
2. Shooting from parking areas except as prescribed under a specially issued Handicap Use Permit.
There is no hunting or shooting from any dike, road, trail, or safety zone.
3. Constructing a shooting pit or permanent blind. Portable blinds are permitted, but must be removed at the end of each hunt.
4. Parking outside designated parking areas. See the ASGA Fennville Farm map for parking lot locations, or contact the area office if questions before parking illegally and unlawfully.
5. Camping in parking areas. Camping is available at the ASGA Ely Lake Campground.
6. Trapping, except under a written permit.
7. Taking of cans or glass bottles into the permit zones, to possess or consume alcoholic beverages, or littering (including spent shotshells)
8. Vehicle or horse use off of county roads or out of designated parking areas, except as authorized by the ASGA Manager.
9. Use of off-road vehicles (ORV) in Allegan State Game Area. – ORVs are unlawful in Allegan State Game Area.
10. Use of dogs, other than waterfowl retrieving dogs while waterfowl hunting, in ASGA Fennville Farm within zones 2-7 and portions of zone 8 (Sec.7, 8, 9 & 17 of T02N,R15W); see map. Dogs may be used for other purposes in remaining areas of the Farm Unit.
11. Other Rules and Regulations for this area may be posted in the area; look for additional signs or notices to ensure you have a safe hunt.

CAUTION: Use care near all water areas; some of areas may contain deep water, depending on season and rainfall. **BE A SAFE HUNTER**
- A safe hunter obeys laws governing hunting & boating, is alert to any conditions hazardous to the safety of themselves and others.
